### **Kerr Regional History Center to host Dr. Michael Cude and Stacy Whittemore Saturday**

**Kerrville, Texas (Oct. 5, 2021)** – The Kerr Regional History Center (KRHC) is pleased to host guest speaker Dr. Michael Cude on Saturday, Oct. 9 at 2 p.m. Cude will present a history of German immigration and migration in Texas and the Hill Country. Cude is a professor of history at Schreiner University in Kerrville, where he is also program coordinator for European Studies and the Global Scholars learning community. He is the author of “History Snapshots: Europe, Ancient and Classical”, published by Hexco Academic, and the forthcoming book “The Slovak Question: A Transatlantic Perspective, 1914–1948” from The University of Pittsburgh Press.



Following the presentation, join Stacy Whittemore, founder of Wayfaring Spoon, as she demonstrates the making of Bierkaesuppe (bear and cheese soup)

and provides an apple strudel, with both available for attendees to sample. Whittemore is a Certified Health Coach, Certified Master Preserver, and Master Wellness Volunteer for Texas A&M extension services. Copies of the recipes will be available as handouts.

The event is free of charge.
