- 4) Olympic Pool – “Barn Swallows” by Julie Magnum, Fredericksburg High School Art Class.
- 5) Kerrville River Trail at Highway 27 – “Riparian” by Mackenzie Wade, Schreiner University and Stillstone Design.

“As a community-supported non-profit, Big Seed attempts to connect young creatives to those who value art,” Big Seed Board Member Jeremy Walther said. “These five mural installations help demonstrate that value. 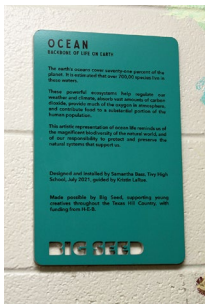
