Mayor issues Declaration of Disaster in response to winter storm

Kerrville, Texas (Feb. 6, 2022) – Kerrville Mayor Bill Blackburn issued a Declaration of Disaster on Friday, Feb. 4, 2022, as severe winter weather adversely impacted the area.

CITY OF KERRVILLE DECLARATION OF DISASTER

WHEREAS, the City of Kerrville, in the County of Kerr County, Texas, on the 4th day of February, 2022, has suffered widespread or severe damage, injury, or loss of life or property (or there is imminent threat of same) resulting from

SEVERE WINTER WEATHER

WHEREAS, the Mayor of Kerrville has determined that extraordinary measures must be taken to alleviate the suffering of people and to protect or rehabilitate property,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED BY THE MAYOR OF KERRVILLE:

1. That a local state of disaster is hereby declared for the City of Kerrville pursuant to §418.108(a) of the Texas Government Code.
2. Pursuant to §418.108(b) of the Government Code, the state of disaster shall continue for a period of not more than seven days from the date of this declaration unless continued or renewed by the City Council of Kerrville.
3. Pursuant to §418.108(c) of the Government Code, this declaration of a local state of disaster shall be given prompt and general publicity and shall be filed promptly with the City Secretary.
4. Pursuant to §418.108(d) of the Government Code, this declaration of a local state of disaster activates the City Emergency Management Plan.
5. That this proclamation shall take effect immediately from and after its issuance.
