

Kerrville still under winter storm warning

Kerrville, Texas (Feb. 1, 2023) – Per the National Weather Service, a heavier round of freezing rain and embedded light sleet is ongoing this morning, with the heaviest icing and impacts across the Hill Country into the I-35 corridor. A Winter Storm Warning remains in effect for Kerrville through Thursday morning.

PER THE KERRVILLE STREET
DEPARTMENT:

- All bridges (including TXDOT



owned) and standard problem inclines inside the city limits have been treated with magnesium chloride and gravel. Seven additional locations were added for treatment overnight. Treatment operations are continual but all streets and bridges are passable at this

time. Due to rainfall and wet streets, ice on road surfaces cannot be readily identified and additional caution must be used.

- Temps remained steady just below freezing with random spells of rain and a light wind.

Most of the precipitation that has fallen was not frozen, with freezing occurring on elevated surfaces, driveways and sidewalks with no snow observed overnight. Sampled road surfaces are reading in the lower 30's.

- Treatment operations will continue with ample material stockpiles remaining.
- Road surfaces are wet with rarely occurring patch ice and caution should be exercised at all times when driving.
- No power outages have been observed.
- Most elevated surfaces, vehicles, sidewalks and driveways have a thin film of ice with little accumulation on trees.
- Forecasts remain largely unchanged.
