City moving to Stage 2 water conservation measures

Kerrville, Texas (Dec. 14, 2023) – On Nov., 15, 2023, the City of Kerrville moved from Stage 4 to Stage 3 water conservation measures. Since then, area drought conditions have continued to improve, with flows returning to the Guadalupe River and many streams and the levels in groundwater wells rising.

The city's Water Production Division continues to make progress on returning four of the city's major wells to service. Two are currently complete and ready to go back into production, one will be ready next week, and the ASR-2 well rehab work should begin this month.

Given the changing drought conditions and the rehabilitation progress on the city's water wells, the city will be moving from Stage 3 to Stage 2 water conservation measures effective 12:01 a.m. on Friday, Dec. 15, 2023.

As an update on the city's groundwater permit, the Headwaters Groundwater Conservation District recently informed the city that it had accepted the city's application for a new groundwater permit. The city hopes to meet with Headwaters in the coming months to

continue working on an understanding of how each applies its water conservation measures, especially during times of drought.

Finally, in several recent actions, the city took steps to limit property owners from using both municipal water and groundwater within the same property.
