R. C. Hickman photography exhibition ends Thursday at the Kerr Regional History Center

Kerrville (Feb. 27, 2024) – The Kerr Regional History Center's beautiful photographic exhibit "Behold the People: R. C. Hickman's Photographs of Black Dallas, 1949–1961," continues through Thursday, Feb. 29 at the History Center, located at 425 Water St. Hours are 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. The free exhibit is presented in coordination with the Dolph Briscoe Center for American History, The University of Texas at Austin, and Humanities Texas.



R. C. Hickman was a Dallas photographer whose thousands of images produced from 1949 to 1961 document aspects of life in an African American community in Texas. Hickman was a native Texan who worked as a commercial photographer, a photojournalist for several black newspapers in Dallas, a freelance photographer for national black publications such as *Jet*, *Sepia* and *Ebony*, and a photographer for the National Association for the Advancement of

Colored People (NAACP). His images reveal his awareness of a community within which individuals survive, grow and understand themselves.

Accompanying these incredible images are some of the Kerr region's local images, many by acclaimed Kerrville photographer Starr Bryden.
