**ORDINANCE NO. 2025-25**

**AN ORDINANCE DISSOLVING THE CITY'S SENIOR SERVICES ADVISORY COMMITTEE BY DELETING SECTION 2-91 "SENIOR SERVICES ADVISORY COMMITTEE" OF CHAPTER 2, "ADMINISTRATION," ARTICLE IV "BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS", OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF KERRVILLE, TEXAS; AND REPEALING THE ORDINANCES WHICH CREATED AND AMENDED THE COMMITTEE**

**WHEREAS**, City Council previously created the Senior Services Advisory Committee ("Committee") whose purpose is to advise Council on elderly issues within the community; and

**WHEREAS**, at the Committee's most recent meeting, the Committee voted unanimously to request that City Council consider dissolving the Committee as its members believe that the Committee's functions could be better suited for the Senior Business Connections of the Hill Country, created by the Dietert Center, and which like the Committee, considers and advises on issues impacting the community's elderly; and

**WHEREAS**, City Council, based upon recommendations from the Committee and staff, believes it beneficial to dissolve the Committee; and

**WHEREAS**, City Council finds it to be in the public interest to dissolve the Committee by deleting Section 2-91, Chapter 2, Article IV of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Kerrville and repealing the ordinances which created and amended the Committee;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KERRVILLE, KERR COUNTY, TEXAS:**

**SECTION ONE.** Section 2-91 of Chapter 2 "Administration," Article IV "Boards and Commissions" of the Code of Ordinance of the City of Kerrville, Texas, is deleted.


**SECTION TWO.** The City Secretary is authorized and directed to submit this amendment to the publisher of the City's Code of Ordinances and the publisher is authorized to amend said Code to reflect the action taken herein and to correct typographical errors and to index, format, and number and letter paragraphs to the existing Code as appropriate.

**SECTION THREE.** The provisions of this Ordinance are to be cumulative of all other ordinances or parts of ordinances governing or regulating the same subject matter as that covered herein; provided, however, that all prior ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with or in conflict with any of the provisions of this Ordinance are expressly repealed to the extent of any such inconsistency or conflict. Accordingly, City Council repeals Ordinance Nos. 2018-32, 2019-05, 2020-02, 2021-26, and 2024-22.

**SECTION FOUR.** If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is, for any reason, held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance. City Council declares that it would have passed this Ordinance and each section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase hereof irrespective of the fact that one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses, or phrases be declared unconstitutional or invalid.


