
Because of this event, a portion of Earl Garrett Street between Highway 27 and Water Street, and a portion of Water Street between Highway 16 and Washington, will close beginning Friday, May 25 at approximately 6 a.m. and will remain closed through the evening of Sunday, May 27.

A portion of Water Street between Highway 16 and Cartewheels Catering will remain open until 2 p.m. on Friday, May 25 to provide access to Peterson Plaza and the south

parking lot. Please note, however, that all vehicles need to be removed from Water Street and the south parking lot in Peterson Plaza no later than 2 p.m. Friday.
